Rental Housing

It was reported that Matt Baumann, Radnor Township's Director of Community Development, has been made aware of the over occupied rentals on Garrett Avenue, one of which was fined and is going to District Court. We are hoping that the Judge will hold the land lords responsible for paying the full fine, not a reduced fine.

Peggy Gaskins noted that in past years Radnor Police attended Freshman Orientation at Villanova University to inform students of Township policies, especially Zero Tolerance. She felt that the students should also be given information about living in a neighborhood, as well as when to call the Township for help even with a landlord, their safety issues and how to handle trash, etc.

Old Business

It was noted that female students have been seen with sleeping bags coming and going from a rental property on Garrett Avenue. Trash is being left out all week or on the sidewalks on Garrett Avenue.

Cars are still being robbed so with this still going on be vigilant and watch out for your neighbors.

New Business

There are six cars without parking permits using little Petrie Avenue for parking and there don't seem to be any citations being issued.

Patty Barker, President of the Garrett Hill Coalition spoke at the Villanova University Community Dinner sponsored by the Student Government on February 23rd.- She thanked our Civic Association for working with the students and providing them with a Welcome Back Picnic upon their return in the Fall. This seems to help some of the student realize that we're all just people just trying to get along for the betterment of our neighborhoods.

It was noted that some Summit Terrace properties had not had the snow shoveled during our numerous storms this winter.

After his appearance at our January 27th meeting, members felt Bob Zienkowski our new Township Manager really cared about our entire Township and has been very responsive to the residents requests and concerns.
