It was suggested that he be invited to speak at one of our future meetings. Other concerns are as follows: many "For Rent" signs on Wentworth Lane properties, many out of state license plates in the neighborhoods now that the colleges are back in session, landlords who own multiple student rentals on Brook Street and Glenbrook Avenue, the Pennsylvania State home on Petrie Avenue. There was a report of speed checks on Conestoga Road by Macrone Park, a sobriety check on Conestoga Road, and a grant for police checks on Route 30.

The July 23rd Concert in Macrone Park was a great success. Sam Horsey won the weather station donated by the Trophy Shop. Mr. Marchesani of Garrett Hill Market donated pizzas for the evening.
